A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

s we look forward to the year ahead of us, The Hearth Board notes our accomplishments of 2022. I'd like to thank each board member for their above and beyond efforts this past year. We had numerous board working sessions to determine the appropriate vendors, timing, requirements, and details of each project. Many hours were also put into onsite in-person inspections of each project by various board members to ensure that the quality and details were being met. Here's what we've done over the past vear.....

Each of our ten monument sites were evaluated. We started off with repairing all the stonework. After that we had a thorough check done on each monument's electrical system, which has caused us problems for years. Fortunately, we found a superior electrician that was highly recommended by Douglas County. Power outlets were updated, in-ground incandescent lighting was replaced with LED bulbs. Damaged in-ground light canisters were replaced, and finally, the background lighting for each 'HEARTH' sign was upgraded from incandescent fixtures to weatherproof LED fixtures.

As a separate project, each of the eight 'HEARTH' signs, along with the 'RETREAT' sign were totally restored with fresh paint and repairs to the lettering where needed.

Our sprinkler system was evaluated and the appropriate repairs were accomplished. The backflow system was also tested to ensure proper operation.

The fencing project was completed in October. This was an extensive project where board members walked each section of the 5 ½ miles of fencing to identify those in need of board replacement and/or painting.

With our new fence painting procedure in place, we were able to paint all four phase areas in 2022 versus only one phase per year.

As a result of our persistence with the Douglas County Roads & Highways department, we finally received approval for the installation of a crosswalk on Valleybrook Drive (across from Paintbrush Park). This project was completed last August.

Community Deterioration

"Deterioration" is a very strong word, but after 20 years, our Community has matured and is beginning to develop some wrinkles and gray hairs. Some homeowners, including rental properties, have not maintained the level of standard that signifies The Hearth and The Retreat areas. Multiple homeowners have voiced concerns that our Community is in decline. This is especially obvious in landscaping and home maintenance. Over the years, multiple yards have deteriorated with dead and dying trees, missing trees, unsightly lawns, drooping wing fences, damaged fences, and homes in need of paint.

To date, HRCA has been responsible for monitoring all architectural issues and property conditions. They have done a good job over the years, but because demands have multiplied in our growing community, some issues have been overlooked, and this is why the HOA Board is planning to be more involved. The Board will work in conjunction with HRCA, acting as a supplemental resource. Board members, in addition to any interested Hearth property owners, will survey the neighborhoods on a fixed schedule. This activity mimics what the HRCA presently does, thus reinforcing property reviews.

Within the Hearth Charter, we are allowed to form an Architectural Review Committee to mend many of the unacceptable conditions that reside within The Hearth. The Hearth Board has decided not to go this route, specifically because this would require volunteering homeowners to become members of this enforcing and directing committee. This would be a significant commitment requiring both time, personal interest and community knowledge. It is unfortunate to say, but recruiting volunteers is extremely difficult.

As noted, in the absence of an ARC, The Hearth Board will begin reviewing neighborhood conditions and submitting letters to homeowners through HRCA, which will define items to be corrected. Our Community deserves the added attention so as to return to the standard that signifies The Hearth.

Need a Chase Drain or Sidewalk Repair?

Here is Douglas County's updated procedure for requesting the installation of a chase drain into the sidewalk in front of your house, or for a needed repair of that sidewalk:

Submit an online request at:

Or call Douglas County Public Works (Deb) at 303-660-7480.

After submitting your request, the process of evaluation, decision, and work order could take up to one year. If approved, the work crew will simply show up when they get to your name on the list. If not approved, you will receive a rejection letter. Nevertheless, you may still apply for a permit to install a chase drain (at your expense).






